By December, I was full-time, and in June 2023, I stepped into the Student Services Coordinator role, helping lead high school outreach, community engagement, and ESL programs.

I was fortunate to help build the outreach and ESL programs, using my community connections and relationships to create programs that students actually trust and rely on. Now, as Student Success Coordinator for the Basic Needs Program and The Learning Center at the Shasta College Tehama Campus, I help students connect with food support, housing resources, financial aid, tutoring, and other community services—making sure they know they're never navigating college alone.
